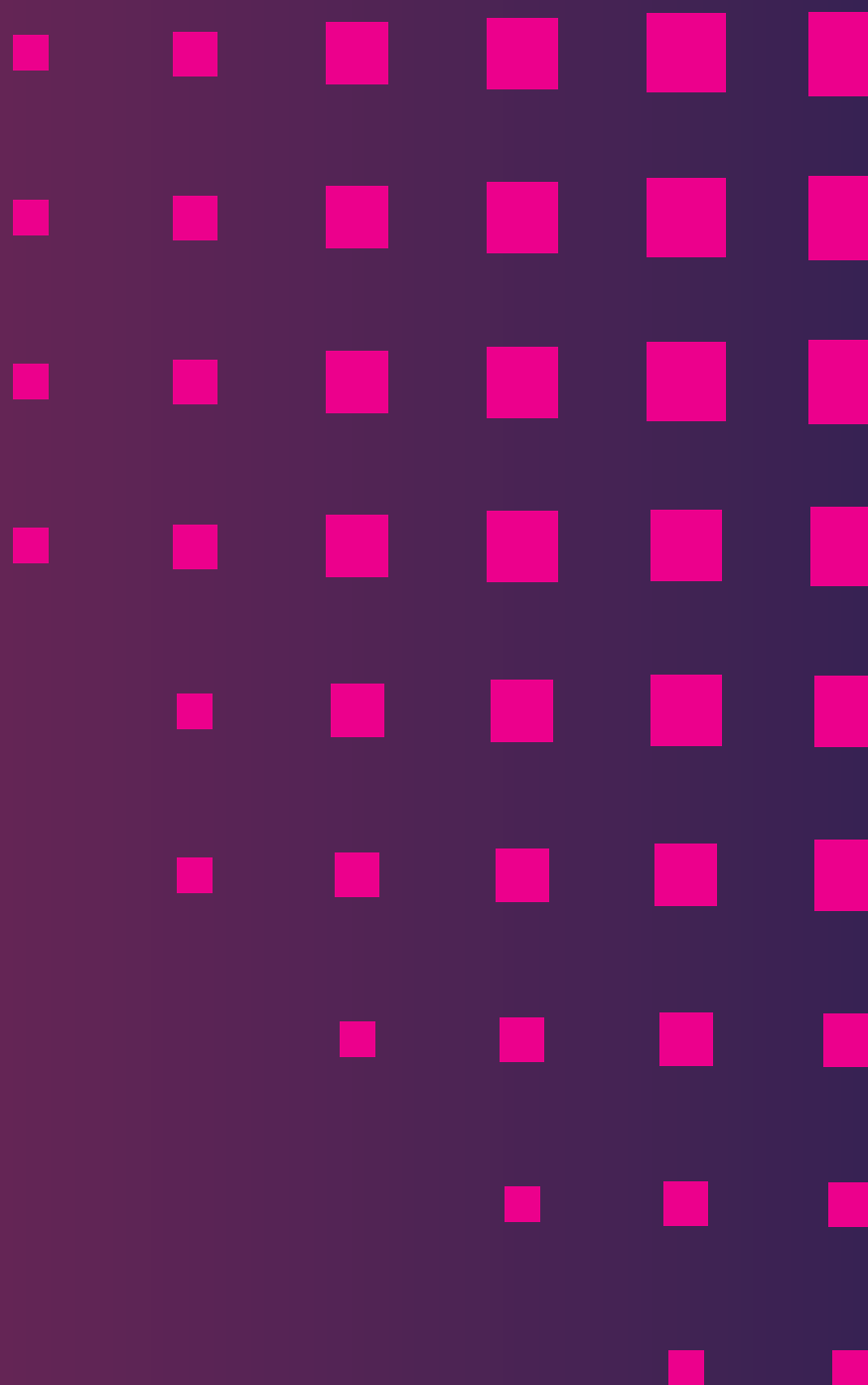

Our Institution's History

The Evolution of AECC:

Founded in 1965 as the first chiropractic training provider in Europe, AECC has been a leader in evidence-based chiropractic education, practice, and research.

Here are key milestones in its journey:

1965:

The Anglo-European College of Chiropractic (AECC) opens in Bournemouth, becoming the first chiropractic college outside North America with 18 students on Cavendish Road, Bournemouth.

1969:

The institution's name changes to "Anglo-European College of Chiropractic" (dropping the 'e') to align with the British Chiropractors' Association's preferred nomenclature.

1982:

AECC purchases Boscombe Convent on Parkwood Road.



1986:

A research department is established to support AECC's postgraduate research efforts.

1988:

The Council for National Academic Awards validates the Bachelor of Science degree at AECC, making it the first institution in complementary healthcare to offer a validated programme.



1990:

HRH Diana, Princess of Wales, becomes AECC's Patron in its 25th anniversary year.

1992:

AECC is accredited by the European Council on Chiropractic Education.

2000:

Accreditation is received from the General Chiropractic Council, regulating chiropractic education in the UK.



2005:

AECC partners with Bournemouth University to validate degrees, enabling public funding for chiropractic education.

2007:

AECC broadens its educational focus to include healthcare subjects other than chiropractic. A BSc (Hons) Clinical Exercise Science course is introduced with Bournemouth University.

2008:

The MSc Medical Ultrasound program is launched, which now enjoys an international reputation and supports NHS colleagues in providing vital clinical imaging capacity.

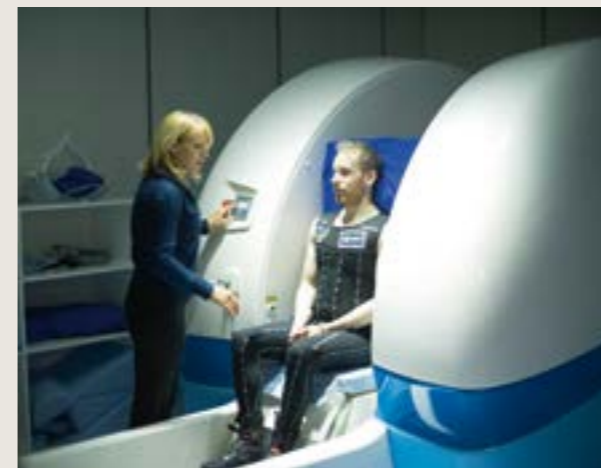


2009:

AECC opens a new, state-of-the-art, purpose-built teaching clinic, with 32 treatment rooms, enhancing its clinical care offering.

2015:

The installation of an open upright MRI scanner (1 of only 7 in the country) enhances AECC's diagnostic capabilities.



2017:

AECC gains Taught Degree Awarding Powers and becomes AECC University College (AECC UC).

2020:

AECC UC purchases St Thomas Garnet's School site to grow its campus on Parkwood Road.

2021:

In partnership with Solent University, AECC UC launches a new PhD program which underpins our expanding research work.



2022:

AECC invest in a new Integrated Rehabilitation Centre - a flagship clinical facility which has transformed our approach to patient care.

2023:

AECC UC now offers over 25 accredited health sciences degree courses across various disciplines.

2024:

- AECC UC opens a new diagnostic clinical imaging centre, including a new CT scanner in partnership with University Hospitals Dorset and a new Brain Health Clinic, a research facility dedicated to brain health in partnership with Dorset HealthCare.
- Following approval from the Office for Students and the Department for Education, the institution is renamed Health Sciences University (HSU).

Health Sciences University:

July 2024:

Health Sciences University (HSU) is officially formed.

August 2024:

University College of Osteopathy joins the HSU family and we establish a London campus.

October 2024:

The official launch of HSU is celebrated, with HRH The Princess Royal installed as its Chancellor.

Our Institution: Who we are and what we do

In August 2024, AECC University College changed its name to Health Sciences University (HSU). This represents a significant milestone in our institutional journey as we proudly carry this new prestigious title.

Our mission to create a healthier society through education, research and clinical care is as relevant and pertinent today as it was when we started our journey 59 years ago as the first chiropractic training provider in Europe.

Our new name reflects our broadened scope, depth and level of ambition. We currently offer around 30 accredited health sciences courses and apprenticeships across 11 distinct professions and a growing portfolio of accredited CPD and master classes to the registered and unregistered health and care workforce. In addition, we have developed a large suite of clinical services and have a growing multi-professional research environment and expertise.

Shortly after the name change, the University College of Osteopathy joined the HSU family. The partnership has brought together two highly respected health science institutions to create a unique inter-disciplinary environment for education, clinical practice and research across a wide range of allied health and related disciplines. The UCO School of Osteopathy is now one of a number schools to proudly sit within HSU.

Never has the need for a specialist university like ours been greater, as we tackle the challenges created by an ageing population, a healthcare system under huge pressure, and an increasing global burden of musculoskeletal conditions and illness.

We are working with healthcare providers and the healthcare system to provide the best training possible to meet society's future needs.

We chose this new name because we didn't want anyone to be in any doubt about who we are and what we stand for. We want to be the leading specialist health sciences university in the UK.

We deliver a wide range of subjects that will make a positive contribution to the health of society, including chiropractic, allied health, sport and exercise, rehabilitation and social science disciplines.

We are driven to deliver educational excellence in all these areas, to provide the next generation of health professionals for our health services, to upskill our current workforce, to improve and advance our world through research, and to improve public and population health.

We are the Health Sciences University.

With our new name also comes a new brand identity. You'll see in the new identity that we literally underline the S for 'Science' in our name. To ensure we help people in the best possible way we are putting science, and evidence-based learning, at the heart of everything we do; be that clinical care, applied research, or teaching our students.

About Today's Ceremony

Today is a celebration of our graduates' achievements. We are delighted to confer our degrees at Bournemouth Pavilion Theatre and to be joined by the internationally renowned Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra.

Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra (BSO)

Serving the South and South West of England, but with a national and international reputation, the Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra has been a cultural beacon since its foundation in 1893. The outstanding artistic leadership of Kirill Karabits was recognised with the Conductor prize at the 2013 Royal Philharmonic Society awards; the citation praising exceptional performance standards, both at their home venue at the Lighthouse Poole, and at venues throughout the South and South West, not least as the major provider of symphonic scale concerts to the cities of Bristol, Exeter and Portsmouth.

The Bournemouth Pavilion Theatre and Ballroom

Similar to us, the Bournemouth Pavilion Theatre and Ballroom came from small roots and has a wealth of history. Initially the Pavilion's main auditorium was not called a theatre, but a Concert Hall, and within a few years it became apparent that it had shortcomings in presenting staged productions.

As a result, in 1933 the stage was enlarged, both in depth and height, and it was reopened as a theatre in July 1934. Numerous further alterations have been undertaken since, including the addition of two storeys to either side of the main entrance in the early 1950s, and the replacement of the large fountain in the forecourt by a smaller one in 1968. In 1998 the building was listed Grade II and its future has therefore been protected.

Owned by BCP Council and managed by BH Live, the Pavilion is Bournemouth's regular home for touring West End stage shows, Opera, Ballet, Pantomime and Comedy. It serves the local Bournemouth community and has become an icon within Bournemouth's tremendous cultural offering.

Today's Ceremony

The ceremony consists of many elements which make our graduation unique, and our special relationship with graduates continues long after graduation, as they become alumni of the institution.

Academic Dress

The wearing of academic dress is a tradition that has persisted since the Middle Ages, when the first universities were founded. Along with the ability to award degrees comes the opportunity to have bespoke academic dress befitting of the university. The university commissioned the design of academic dress by our gowners, William Northams.

Our graduates are wearing different gowns and hoods to indicate the level of award and Senior Officers of the University (members of the Board of Governors, Vice-Chancellor and Executive Team) wear ceremonial academic robes and caps for important occasions such as graduation.
