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


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
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Synthesis focus group

Actions recommended by students for OEIs to become more inclusive

- Training:
 - EDI topics, to improve awareness and knowledge: **faculty** + students
 - Active bystander: calling out biases and negative views is a collective responsibility of students, staff and the OEI
- Support to students from underrepresented groups
- Active strategies to promote diversity amongst patients in clinical training
- Increase representativeness in curricula
